- Mar 2 **Singers & musicians:** 8.15 pm start. *Free entry*
- Mar 9 **Stanley Accrington:** a welcome return for the one and only Stan with his wit and humorous songs, the occasional serious offering and plenty of banter.
- Mar 16 **Ribbon Road:** powerful and well crafted songs, tight harmonies and sensitive arrangements with a traditional feel yet with contemporary relevance.
- Mar 23 **Roy Bailey:** after 50 years of performing Roy remains a powerful and compelling entertainer. A longtime favourite of the Topic we are delighted to welcome Roy back after too long an absence.
- Mar 30 **Phil Cockerham Trio:** local singer songwriter Phil brings his excellent trio, thought-provoking songs, plus a dash of traditional material in his own style
- Apr 6 **Singers and musicians:** 8.15pm start. *Free entry.*
- Apr 13 **Iain Thomson & Marc Duff:** contemporary songs with a traditional twist from a "singing shepherd" and Marc, multi-instrumentalist of Capercaillie fame.
- Apr 20 **Wilcox:Hulse:** previously two thirds of the popular Queensbury Rules, a duo strong on vocals and harmonies, and songs with a social conscience.

- May 18 **Susan Herndon (USA):** hugely experienced troubadour from Oklahoma with sensitive self-penned material reflecting the universality of human experience.
- May 25 **Ben Savage & Hannah Sanders:** highly respected duo from East Anglia from a folk-singing background who have evolved their own sound and style.
